Leadership program

The YCNA leadership program began this year with a 5-day leadership workshop entitled *"Adjusting the Sails"*. It was a program that offered a holistic approach to leadership where participants integrated their strengths, character and values into their leadership while bringing their whole selves to the role: body, mind and spirit. Gen 2 congress

YCNA hosted 2 conferences for the gen of the Focolare; one in New York, June 2022 and a second one in Vancouver Canada, December 2022. The gen strive to live Focolare spirituality in their everyday environment of school, home, at work and come together regularly to share, support and encourage each other. Once a year they come together from across North America. Topics in June included living a balanced life-style in our relationship with God, others and ourselves, communication and the communion of goods. In December, the group reviewed aspects of their lifestyle through the lives of Focolare youth in the process of canonization, and reflected on how to handle suffering, living a balanced life, prayer life and various possible vocations.





Luminosa Youth School

The Luminosa Youth School was back in full force this past summer after the 2-year shutdown. As with many companies and programs, we too had time to regroup, refocus and improve what we offer. While the restart can be slow, we tried to remain flexible to help the participants have the best program possible. The visa application process remained a challenge, but 9 young adults were able to attend from the US and other countries. Through lessons, educational trips, volunteer work sessions and community life, the program offered an experience of growth and development. 

Almost every Friday night, the **Atlanta** focolare houses host a "young adult pizza night." At times there's a program after dinner like watching the movie on Chiara Lubich together or a documentary on ecology, but mostly it's an informal opportunity for the young adults to talk. Gen, young adults new to the Focolare, and those who don't know anything about it are invited. Not everyone knows each other, but they've found a "safe space" (as some have called it) in the focolare, where they can have time for deep conversation and connection. One young adult who just met the Focolare even wanted to celebrate her birthday in the focolare one Friday and invited all of her friends to come. It seems this is a fruit of the love she's felt which she wants others to experience.
